



# Diacomit in Qatar

The MoPH named-patient coordination pathway — indicative 2026

## The clinical situation

Diacomit (stiripentol) is FDA-approved as adjunctive therapy for seizures associated with Dravet syndrome in patients aged 6 months and older who are also taking clobazam, manufactured by Biocodex. Dravet is a severe, early-onset epileptic encephalopathy typically caused by SCN1A mutations. Diacomit is available as oral capsules or oral-suspension sachets dosed at approximately 50 mg/kg/day divided into two or three doses, used alongside clobazam and other anti-seizure medications. The treating paediatric neurologist confirms SCN1A genotype or phenotype-based diagnosis and sets the overall ASM plan.

### The pathway, 5 steps

- 1 Consultation with paediatric neurology.** Dravet syndrome diagnosis (genetic confirmation where available), current clobazam regimen, and Diacomit add-on rationale.
- 2 MoPH named-patient application.** Physician files with MoPH Pharmacy & Drug Control Department including clinical letter, paediatric patient identifier, and product details.
- 3 US-side sourcing & logistics.** Reserve Meds coordinates product through our US-licensed DSCSA-compliant specialty wholesale partner.
- 4 Shipment.** Diacomit ships at controlled room temperature; no cold-chain is required.
- 5 Arrival & dosing initiation.** Weight-based dosing begins alongside clobazam and other ASMs under specialist supervision.

### Indicative economics

### Indicative first-dose timing
